The year 2022 was a milestone, a testament to the transformative power of collaboration. In December, we proudly marked the start of a new phase of our evolution. The expansion of our trauma informed care will be made concrete through our local, state, and national partnerships. This will open the door to new possibilities and opportunities for more human trafficking survivors.

Programmatic Success

We welcomed several new Residents in 2022. While some survivors began their journey at Sanctum House, several others have graduated and since joined our staff, “paying it forward” as sisters and mentors. These steps forward underscore the power of our comprehensive trauma informed care: safe housing, healthcare, education, and vocational training. Your support has been the cornerstone.

Expanding Our Footprint

To meet the growing housing needs we are expanding our facility. In partnership with Interior Designers Coalition for Change (IDCFC), and by implementing Trauma-Informed Design, we will provide additional housing for survivors in need. Funding from federal legislation will cover the purchase of our property, with any remaining funds designated to some of the necessary renovations.

Professional Alliance

Our partnerships have strengthened with healthcare professionals, peer institutions, and law enforcement. These partnerships amplify our ability to support survivors, increase awareness among key professionals such as doctors and nurses, and establish lasting relationships, thereby broadening our network.

Engaging Our Community

Through speaking engagements and awareness events, we’ve attracted countless hearts and minds to our mission. Our graduates have become active in the local community, sharing their stories and the importance of Sanctum House. We’ve expanded our volunteer network, and welcomed more community members to our initiatives than any year before.

Spreading our Wings

The Wings of Courage Annual Fundraising Benefit is a monument to the strength of the human spirit. With so little opportunity to join together as one, Wings of Courage has become our moment of congregation. Our Survivors tell us that it is one of the greatest displays of community support they see each year.

As we look towards the future, our path is clear. We remain steadfast in our commitment to our local community, in our outreach and education efforts, and our focus on our program's resources and capabilities to help survivors recover from trauma and trafficking.

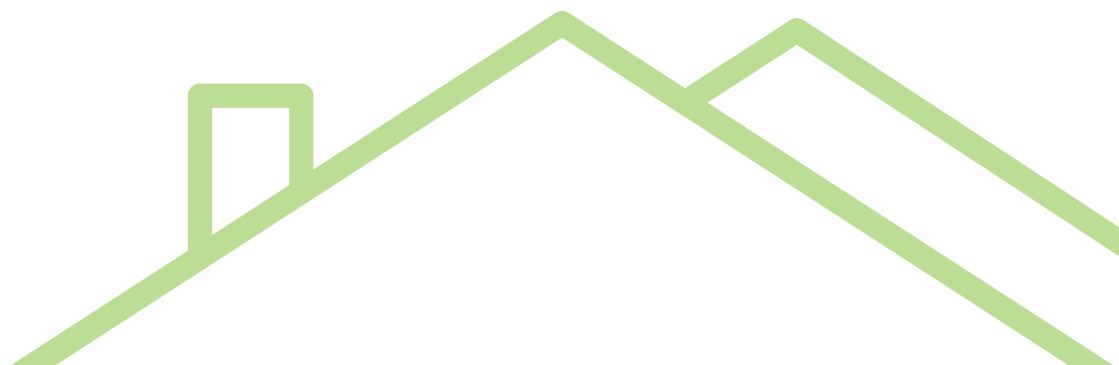

Trauma-Informed Care

Sanctum House staff have continued to improve our Trauma-Informed Care Program.

Each year, staff refreshes our training and updates best practices to ensure we are providing the best possible care.

Our program is always adapting. In 2022, we solidified many best practices ahead of our first audit. This set up Sanctum House as we prepared to collaborate with local and state agency partners.

Every other week, Clinical Psychologist specializing in trauma, Dr. Kathryn Tucker, provides Professional Development on Trauma-Informed Care. This includes reviewing ongoing trauma issues, and effective ways to deal with complex situations.

Community Growth

2022 was a year of tremendous community growth. We held Wings of Courage at the M1 Racetrack & Event Concourse providing a more professional and comfortable event experience. Sanctum House has also grown our volunteer network, and received monetary gifts from over 500 donors in 2022!

Volunteering at Sanctum House blossomed in 2022. Our community reliably supports Residents with a variety of needs, including errands, mentorship, cooking classes, and more.

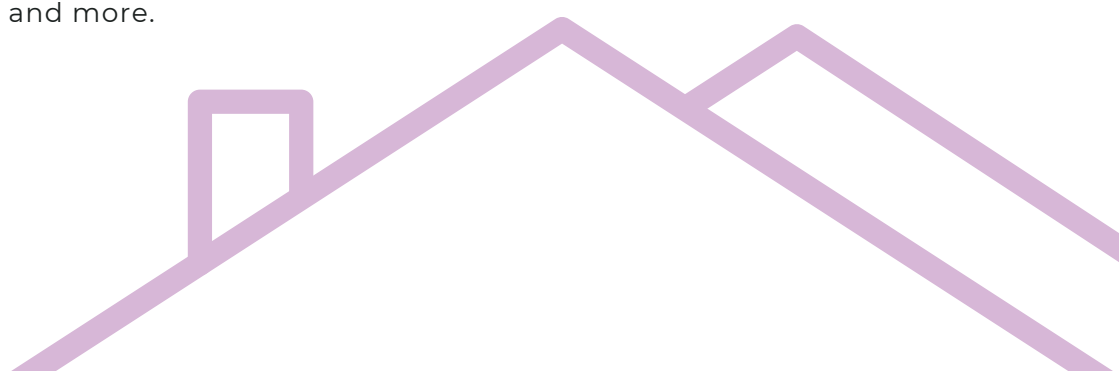
